Resourceful Kansas, funded through the U.S. Department of Energy, is now accepting applications from eligible organizations to attend an energy efficiency seminar at the Riley County Public Works facility in Manhattan, Kansas. The next seminar is scheduled for **October 26, 2011**, and is open to all eligible organizations, regardless of location. There are no registration fees and lunch is provided, but seating is limited so **apply online** at www.resourcefulkansas.org/ to reserve your seat today!

Take a tour of the Riley County facility and observe first-hand the operations of renewable energy sources—wind turbines, solar-powered LED lighting, solar hot water heating system for radiant floor heat, geothermal (ground source) heat pumps, and more.

In addition to the hands-on tour, the seminars will provide information on the following topics:

- Lighting
- Wind/Solar Power
- HVAC
- Financing
- Building Envelope

Select organizations will be eligible for a free, on-site energy assessment conducted by GBA Architects + Engineers following the seminar. These assessments will address energy usage, renewable energy generation, and transportation impacts, and will include customized cost/benefit reviews and development of prioritized lists of energy-saving technologies and recommended modifications.



Who is eligible to apply?

- City, County and State facilities (e.g., police, fire and emergency response, public works)
- Unified School Districts (district, groups of schools, or individual schools) and Private Schools
- Colleges, Universities and Technical Schools
- Agribusiness (e.g., confined hog operations, grain-drying facilities, feed yards, grain elevators, dairies)
- Non-Profit Organizations (e.g., museums, educational facilities, houses of worship, libraries, hospitals)
